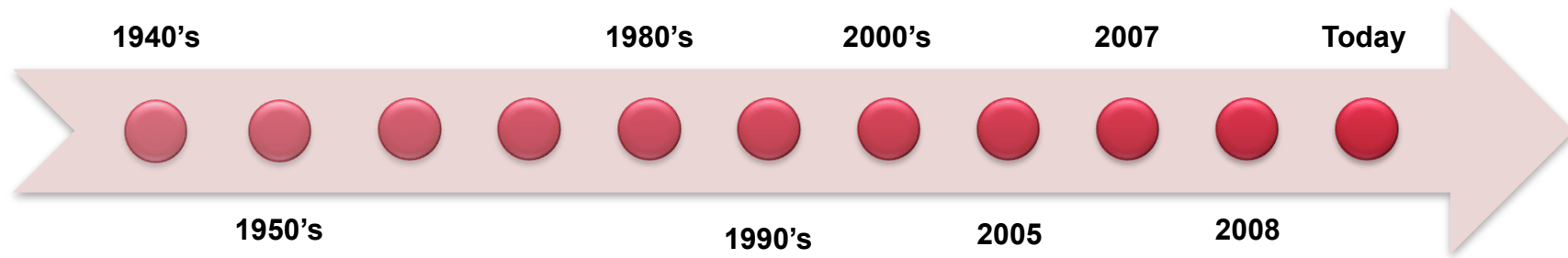

# 1940's: Royal Ordnance Factory



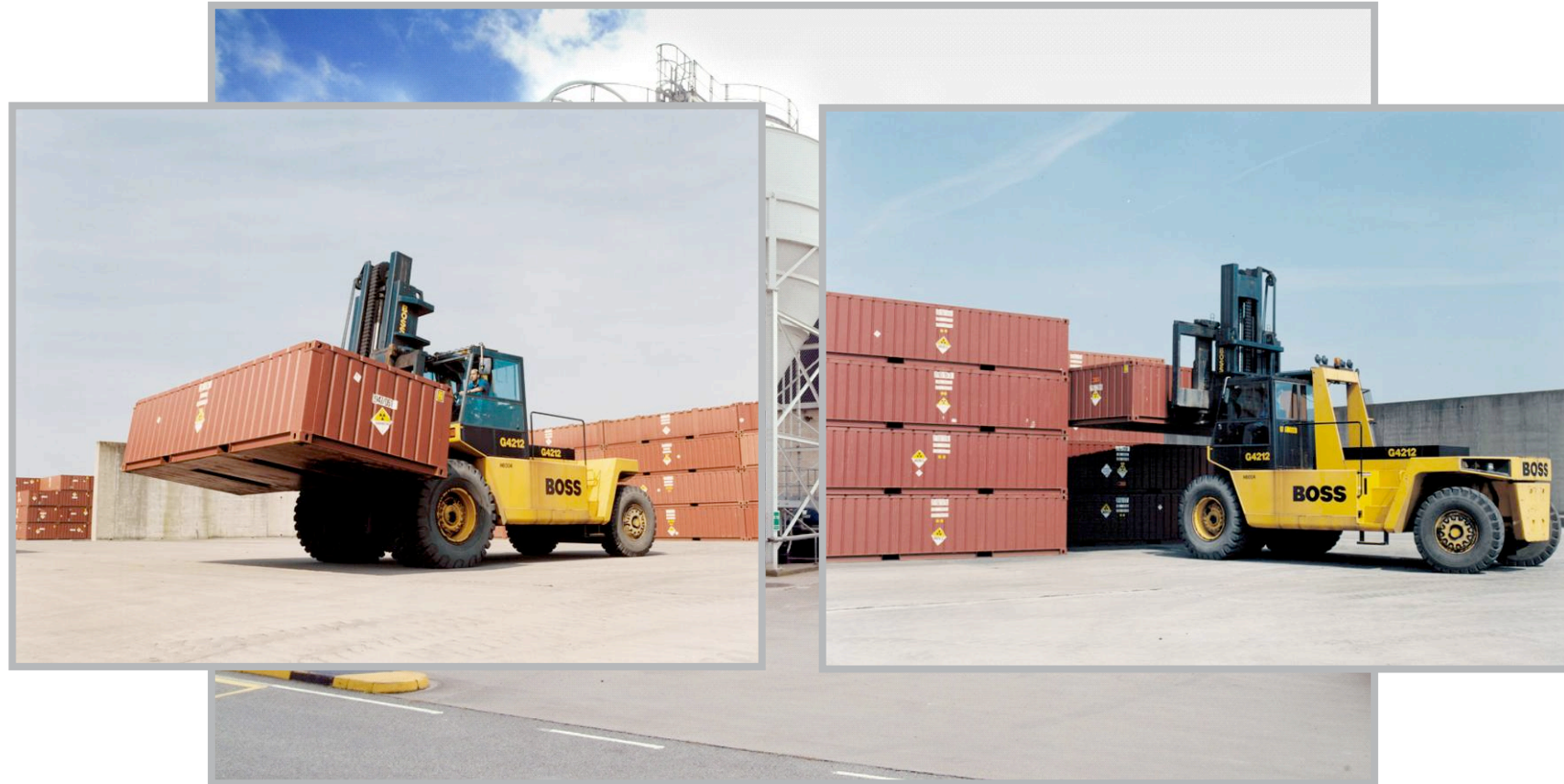
# 1950's: Low Level Waste Disposal

## Civil Nuclear Constabulary

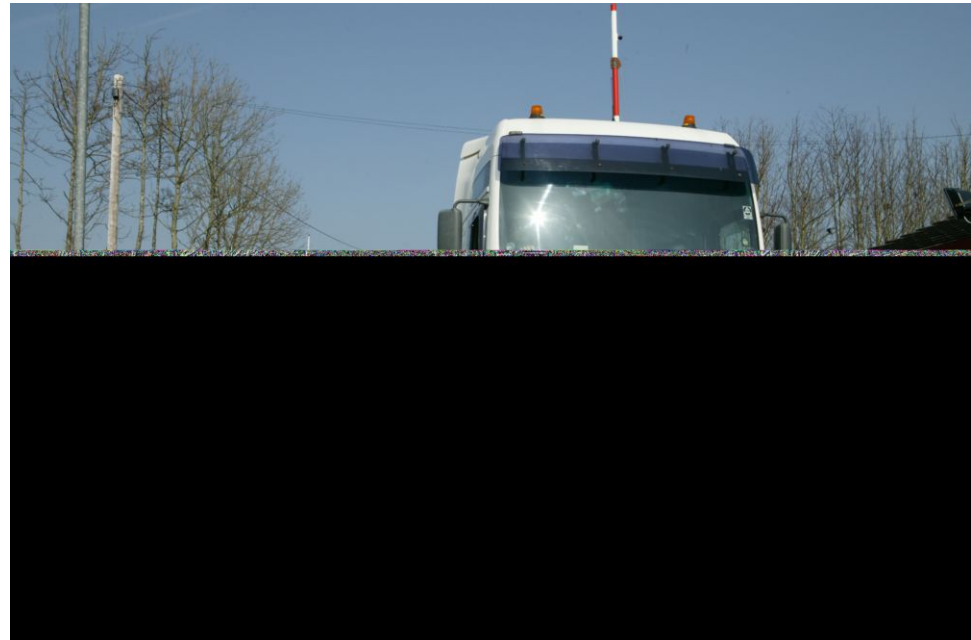
- 24 Hour Armed Constabulary Service
- Trained Dog Handler Unit
- Powers of Arrest
- Back-up of Armed Officers from Sellafield
- Security Alarms on **Nine** Facilities



# Security Changes Made 2:

## Leigon Guard Force

- 24 Hour Guard Force Service
- Keen Approach to patrolling
- Back-up of Armed Officers from Sellafield
- Security Alarms on **Two** Operational Facilities



## The Future One Year On

- Ongoing Review of Guard Force Service
- Continuing Liaison with CNC
- Regular Inspections by The UK Security Regulator
